A New Exhibition opens at Durham University Library

The following information has been sent to us for circulation to members.

'Magazines that shocked Britain go on show at Durham University

The magazines which launched the careers of writers such as Sherlock Holmes' creator Sir Arthur Conan Doyle will form part of a new exhibition at Durham University from...February 4.

Outrageously Modern! will explore magazine culture from the late 19th Century serialised novels of Charles Dickens to the scandalous literature and art of Oscar Wilde and forward into the 20th Century.

Drawn from Durham University's outstanding collections, the exhibition at the Wolfson Gallery, Palace Green Library, Durham City, will show how these avant-garde magazines often defied tradition and convention.

The exhibition title, *Outrageously Modern!*, comes from publisher Holbrook Jackson who described the notorious 1890s magazine *The Yellow Book* as being associated with "all that was bizarre and queer in art and life, with all that was outrageously modern".

Items on show include a review of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*, which accuses the novel of "horrible and disgusting absurdity"; a hand-made book, containing the scandalous first version of Oscar Wilde's *The Picture of Dorian Gray*; and the first publishing of T.S. Eliot's pioneering poem *The Waste Land*.

The exhibition runs...until Sunday, May 20. It is part of the wider and on-going Treasures of Durham University exhibition at the Wolfson Gallery, in Palace Green Library.

Alongside the exhibition, The Shop at Palace Green Library will open as part of the on-going development of the Library as a visitor attraction.

This high-end gift shop will offer quirky book-themed gifts, beautiful artwork and jewellery by local artists and an exciting range of publications to stimulate the most obsessive of book-lovers.

The Wolfson Gallery is open from Tuesdays to Fridays, 10am to 4.45pm, and at weekends from noon to 4.45pm.
